EVENT DESCRIPTION



The Canmore Canada Cup consists of 4 days of racing:

- 1. UCI XCO #1 C1 Race Wednesday June 12, 2024
- 2. UCI and AB Cup XCC C3 Race Thursday Evening, June 13, 2024
- 3. UCI XCO #2 C1 Junior Series Race and AB Cup XCO Saturday, June 15, 2024

New for 2024

ORGANIZER

- In 2024, the Canmore Canada Cup is going above what the UCI requires for prizing. Prize money for the C1 XCO #2 on June 15 will be as per HC requirements. Total Prize Purse is over \$30,000.
- Adaptive Bike categories will be included for the XCC, Super D, and Alberta Cup XCO. Given that this is a new category, it is considered more of a "Pilot Event" to gauge applicability and to determine requirements and potential sanctioning in the future. More details are provided later in the Tech Guide.

This event is hosted in partnership between Cycling Canada, the Alberta Bicycle Association, and the Alberta Nationals Mountain Bike Race Association. The races are taking place at the Canmore Nordic Centre which has purpose-built mountain bike trails and facilities designed to host racing events. The Canada Cup series is designed to provide competitive opportunities to the next generation of cyclists, transitioning from provincial race series to international competitions.

EVENT RULES/LICENSES

<u>UCI regulations</u> and <u>CC-specific regulations</u> will be enforced for all Canada Cup Categories. The <u>Alberta</u> <u>Bicycle Association (ABA) specific regulations</u> will be enforced for all other categories.

Adaptive Category

Included in the 2024 Canmore Canada Cup is a "pilot event" for adaptive riders. With the goal of starting the process to create a sanctioned category for adaptive cycling, the idea for 2024 is to create criteria for the category that will provide an understanding of the issues, as well as the pros and cons of the criteria. Based on the results and feedback in 2024, a conversation can begin on legitimizing the category.

So as not to "reinvent the wheel", the existing UCI standards for E-Bike's will be used. For the 2024 Canada Cup, the bikes used for the Adaptive Category must conform to UCI Cycling Regulations (Version as of January 1, 2024), Part 4 Mountain Bike, Chapter VIII E-Mountain Bike, Sections 4.8.001 and 4.8.005. There will be one category including all age groups. These regulations can be accessed from the "UCI regulations" tab above, in this section.

REGISTRATION

Canada Cup XCC & XCO Race

All riders competing in Canada Cup categories must have a valid UCI license. All participants attending from out-of-country must possess a valid UCI license from their country of residence. Holders of UCI international licenses that do not bear a photograph will be required to present an approved and valid government photo ID in addition to their UCI license. There will be no "One-Day" Licence issued for Canada Cup categories.

U17 and Junior riders must possess a UCI Racing License with the "Expert" ability designation, or the highest available designation in their issuing province/territory/country.







Alberta Cup XCC & XCO Race, including Adaptive Categories

All riders competing in the Alberta Cup categories must either have a valid UCI license or purchase a day license for the race. A maximum of 3 "day licenses" can be purchased by a racer in the year. After the 3rd day license, a full UCI license is required. A day license can be purchased for an additional \$20 per race.

Important Note Regarding Alberta Cup Categories and Prizing:

- The Alberta Bicycle Association uses registration criteria based on ability, rather than on age. The following provides guidance in determining the appropriate category for registration. In all categories, except Expert and Elite, the racer may or may not have a UCI License. If a day license is required (including the Adaptive Category), an additional \$20 will be charged on top of the registration fee for each race signed up for. (\$20 for 1 race; \$40 for 2 races; and \$60 for all 3)
- Prizing for all AB Cup categories will be for both men and women. In addition, separate podiums will occur for U11 and U13.

Note :_Even though prize money is being provided for U23 in XCO #2, there is not a separate U23 category in XCO #2. U23's will race as part of the Elite category. Prize money will be awarded based on the greater amount of the overall Elite prize money or the U23 prize money. For example, if a U23 finishes 1st in U23, but 4th overall, they will be awarded \$709.86 and no one will receive the top U23 prize money of \$567.89. If the next U23 finishes 8th overall, they will receive the amount of the 2nd place U23 of \$376.23. No one will receive \$283.95, as per 8th place Elite.

Canada Cup Series points will be awarded as outlined in the <u>Canada Cup Series Regulations</u> for both XCO #1 and XCO #2 as per the following table:

UCI Junior Series Category

Please see the below entry criteria for the UCI Junior Series event, as mandated by the UCI. The full UCI Junior Series Criteria can be found <u>here</u>.

Canadian-licensed riders	Riders who possess a license issued in Canada will need to meet the following criteria: — Must hold a UCI Junior License, with the "Expert" ability designation
Non-Canadian Licensed riders	 Riders licensed outside of Canada will need to meet the following criteria, as mandated by the UCI: Must hold a UCI Junior License; Must have at least 20 UCI points (for riders in Europe) or 1 UCI point (for riders outside of Europe) in the latest UCI XCO individual junior ranking; or, Must have been entered by their National Federation (maximum of 5 supplementary riders per category) Riders belonging to a UCI elite MTB team or a UCI MTB team

RACE PACKAGE PICK-UP

Package pick-up will be available at the registration office on June 11 to 14 (see schedule). Race packages can be picked up by the rider or a representative; however, the rider's UCI license must be presented to pick up the package. If the package is being picked up by a representative, they must have a valid UCI license. See the full weekend schedule below for Race Office hours of operation.

- 1. Laps and Race Distances to be confirmed by the UCI Chief Commissaire. Details to be provided during the Team/Rider Meeting on June 11 for XCO #1 and June 13 for XCC and XCO #2.
- 2. The starting order for each race will be in chronological order as listed above. All XCC starts will occur at the same time.
- 3. For the XCO's, depending on registration numbers, some categories may be combined. Otherwise, there will be a 1 minute gap between starts for the XCO.
- 4. Total registration numbers may affect the format and times for XCC races. High numbers may result in increasing the course length, separating combined starts and adjusting a start time to a slightly later start, or other strategies. Low numbers may result in combining categories and altering of start times.

Rider call-ups will follow the order set forth by the UCI and Canada Cup Regulations. (See below.)

<u>U17 (CC)</u>

- 1. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
- 2. Random order by plate number distributed

Junior (CC)

- 1. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
- 2. Random order by plate number distributed

Junior (Junior Series)

1. As per the most recently published UCI XCO juniors individual ranking of the current season (or the final ranking of the previous season if no ranking has yet been published for the current season).

>> All riders with UCI points, regardless of how they have been registered or have met the entry criteria.

2. Unclassified riders by rotation:

The start order of the riders within the team must be confirmed by the teams during the rider's confirmation. The start order among the teams is determined as follows:

- First, national teams whose order is determined by the nations' classification of the concerned category from the most recent world championships.
- Second, unclassified national teams whose order is determined by drawing lots.
- Third, UCI Elite Mountain Bike teams whose order is determined by the most recent team ranking.
- Last, UCI Mountain Bike teams whose order is determined by the most recent team ranking.

The teams (in the order as mentioned above) are taken in turn with the teams' first riders starting in sequence, then the teams' second riders etc.

3. Unclassified riders team B of the national federation of the organizing country: drawing lots.

Junior (UCI)

- 1. All riders on the current UCI ranking
- 2. Top 16 of the current Canada Cup Ranking
- 3. Random order by plate number distributed

U23/Elite (W/F & M/H)

- 1. All riders on the current UCI ranking
- 2. All riders on the current Canada Cup Ranking
- 3. Random order by plate number distributed

The Canmore Nordic Centre Provincial Park is located within a 90-minute drive of Calgary's International

Airport and is just a five-minute drive from Canmore. It offers a variety of recreational activities including cross country skiing, biking, hiking, disk golf and orienteering. Host site of the 1988 Olympic Winter Games Nordic events, the Canmore Nordic Centre continues to host regional, national and international events year-round.

The Canmore Nordic Centre is located in an area that is home to many species of wildlife including bears. When recreating in bear country, your best strategy to avoid an encounter with a bear is to make lots of noise, stay in groups and be alert for signs of bears. In the rare case of an aggressive confrontation, bear spray is your best defense.

The requirement to carry bear spray during the races will be dictated by Alberta Parks officials and will be disclosed at the Team Manager's meetings on June 11 and 13.



Kananaskis Conservation Passes

Alberta Forestry and Parks have instituted a new parking pass requirement for the Canmore Nordic Centre. Participants, volunteers, sponsors and staff for all events <u>must</u> purchase the KCPass <u>ONLINE</u> and


Cycling Canada affiliated Trade Teams will have access to technical space.


